

### Expresiones con el infinitivo - Verbs 1

You have already learned that the infinitive of a verb in Spanish ends in -ar, -er, or -ir. We can use the infinitive form of the verbs tener (to have), ir (to go), and acabar (to finish) with another verb or expression. You have already seen the infinitive used in the following sentences.

**¿Qué desean ustedes tomar?**      and      **Debes estudiar y aprender más.**

Here are some other useful expressions that are followed by the infinitive:

**tener que** - to have to

**ir a** - to be going to

**acabar de** - to have just (done something)

- **Tengo que comer algo. Voy a ir a la cafetería.**

- **Yo no. Acabo de comer y no tengo hambre.**

Practice the forms of these verbs. Remember that all Spanish verbs change their endings according to the subject and whether the verb is an -ar, -er, or -ir verb.
