The Menu Project: Chapter 4

You will create a menu entirely in Spanish (No English words are allowed)!

FORMAT:

1. It can be in a brochure format (double or triple fold) or on an 8.5x11 sheet of paper.
2. It can be hand-made, done on a computer, or a combination of both.
3. It will contain **at least five images**. If you have five sections, have at least one image for each section. If you have a “front” of your menu (brochure or double fold format) there must be an image on the front.

CONTENT:


1. It will have **at least the following sections, with pictures.**

- 1-Breakfast (Desayuno)
- 2- Lunch (Almuerzo)
- 3- Dinner (Cena)
- 4- Drinks (Bebidas)

You can also add a section for:

- 5- Desserts (Postres)

2. Each section needs to have a **title** that clearly stands out (see above^).
3. Choose a **name** for your restaurant. The name must be in Spanish. If it is called something like “Johnny’s” it needs to be translated as “El restaurante/el café **de Johnny**” (or El café de Juanito!).
4. Everything should be written in Spanish. Use your Chapter 4 vocabulary sheet or your textbook to find the names of foods. If you must use a Spanish dictionary, make sure you are using it for no more than 2-3 words. **You must include at least 20 foods from our Chapter 4 vocabulary on your menu.**
